No. Station wagons don't have to be huge voluminous boxy affairs with truck-like appointments and a scrubby ride. And our Bonneville is the supreme example why not. Of course it is voluminous inside (where it should be), but there the similarity abruptly ends.


For the Pontiac Bonneville is sheer luxury on wheels. Its smart instrument panel is trimmed with walnut. And things like an electric clock, parking brake warning light, ashtray-cigar lighter lamp, courtesy lamp, glove-box lamp and flexible assist grip are standard equip-


ment. So are articulated wipers, custom steering wheel and deluxe wheel discs. So are carpeting (all the way back and even up the tailgate), a third seat, and a power-operated tailgate window. And so is that expanded Morrokide interior you see above, complete with six seat belts, in blue, black, or bronze. But does this mean we've forgotten what station wagons really are? Perish the thought.

The Bonneville's 333-hp V-8 is the most powerful standard engine of *any* wagon. And you can order up to 356 hp if you want more. The

standard transmission is an all-synchronized 3-speed. A four-speed is optional at extra cost. And when you order the Turbo Hydra-Matic you get a low rear-axle ratio for a combination of eager performance and stringent economy.



The chrome luggage rack, and the luxurious Cordova vinyl roof, in ivory, black, or beige. 2. Horizontal wind deflector helps keep the rear window clear in bad weather. 3. this, who wants to ride frontwards? 4. Window screens for the tailgate window and both rear doors are worth their weight in gold on summer camping trips. 5. A power tailgate window, standard on Bonnevilles and Catalina 3-seat station wagons, is extra cost on Catalina 2-

All 1966 Pontiacs are fitted as standard equipment with the following safety items: instrument panel pad, outside left-hand rear view mirror, articulated two-speed wipers with glare-reducing blades and arms, windshield washers, padded sun visors, seat belts for all seats, and backup lamps. And, naturally, all Pontiacs are Wide-Tracks.



You might say the Pontiac Catalina is our best foot forward. For here's where we combine all the roominess and comfort of a big luxurious Pontiac with a price that makes you think we stole the sticker from a low-priced make.

The interior is not only roomy, it looks as if it was originally meant to be a limousine. Lush carpeting blankets the passenger area. The instrument panel is finished in a rich black texture. The interior is all Morrokide, elegant yet practically indestructible, and available in

bronze, red, blue, turquoise, or black. The two-seat model comes with four seat belts, the three-seater with six. You get a parking brake warning light, ashtray-cigar lighter lamp, courtesy lamp, 2-speed articulated windshield wipers, windshield washers and many safety items including those detailed at left at no additional cost.

The standard engine is a 389-cu. in. V-8 that squeezes 256 hp from regular gas. (Yes, *regular* gas!) And with it you get the versatile fully-synchronized 3-speed manual transmission. The four-speed man-

ual is extra. If you order the Turbo Hydra-Matic, we up the horsepower to 290, but you can keep the regular-fuel engine by specifying so. Our standard axle ratio is matched to normal requirements, but you can choose other ratios if you like. Your dealer can help you with this.

And, of course, one of the joys of buying a Pontiac is the superb list of optional equipment you can choose from. Get together with your dealer. He'll show you how you can do everything but redesign the car. And who'd want to do that?

Want economy and luxury, too? Pontiac Tempest Custom for '66.



When it comes to squeezing luxury out of a dollar, Pontiac engineers have no peers. Yes, we said luxury. Look inside a Pontiac Tempest Custom and you'll see what we mean. There are yards of nylon blend carpeting underfoot, and bright metal skid strips over the padded, removable, vinyl mat in back. The seats are Morrokide Madrid grain in either blue, turquoise, bronze, or red. Four seat belts are standard.

A host of safety features including those listed at right are standard equipment in the Tempest Custom. But perhaps the most intriguing

standard feature is the brilliant new overhead cam six power plant. This tiger delivers 165 hp from six cylinders using regular gas by the neat trick of putting the camshaft directly over the valves and eliminating a number of valve train parts, which results in more power from less gas.

Since the Tempest Custom is a Pontiac, it naturally offers you, in addition to the six, a 250-hp regular gas V-8, or a 285-hp premium gas V-8. Coupled to these power plants is a fully-synchronized three-

speed manual transmission. An all-synchro 4-speed is optional at extra cost. So is an improved two-speed torque converter automatic transmission.


Your choice of axle ratios is typically wide. And if you want to toughen up your Wide-Track with special springs and shocks, just say so.
