NEW IMPERIAL FOR 1968

Imperial for 1968 is large in every way. It weighs more than 5,000 pounds, is almost 19 feet long, and is powered by Chrysler Corporation's largest engine, a 440-cubic-inch V-8.

Designed for maximum motoring enjoyment with dozens of luxury items as standard equipment, Imperial's sculptured-metal styling emphasizes its size and strength. Unitized body construction resists the twisting forces caused by road irregularities and torsion bar front suspension provides outstanding cornering ability. Imperial goes on sale September 14.

"The engineers and designers have put a great deal more than luxury into this luxury
car," said Robert Anderson, general manager of the Chrysler-Plymouth Division. "It is also
a remarkable road car."

High speed performance has been improved through the use of larger diameter exhaust valves, and combustion chambers have been modified to reduce exhaust emissions. For even quicker performance response, the "440 Dual" with dual snorkle air cleaner and dual exhausts is available as an option.

New, high quality upholstery fabrics and new interior trims appear throughout the line. The deeply recessed instrument panel, embossed with rich antique bronze overlays, has even more safety padding and gauges and instruments are arranged for maximum driver convenience.

There are five Imperial models: the four-door sedan, Crown four-door hardtop, Crown two-door hardtop, convertible and LeBaron four-door hardtop.

The 1968 Imperial has a new grille of horizontal design with the Imperial medallion centered and two dual moldings which stretch the length of the car along the body sides.

Air conditioned Imperials will be equipped with the Auto-Temp automatic temperature control system, an electro-mechanical device which enables the driver to maintain a constant interior car temperature.

A new luxury option is the AM/FM stereo multiplex, which offers passengers a choice of AM, FM, or FM stereo radio, utilizing as many as five speakers. A new stereo tape player can be installed in conjunction with any of the three available radio packages. There also is a new cowlmounted headlamp dimmer, completely transistorized, which is available in conjunction with the Safeguard Sentinel automatic headlight actuator.

Among the luxury items which are standard equipment are the new cornering lamps which illuminate the road on each side of the car with over 500 candlepower when the turn signals are actuated. Other luxury items which are standard on, for example, the LeBaron four-door hardtop, are: automatic transmission, power steering, power brakes, power windows, sliding assist straps, retractable safety belts, six-way power seats, power vents, roadside warning flashers, heater, three-ribbon whitewall tires, reading lamps, four arm rest storage compartments, four cigarette lighters, and many others.

Added to the 14 safety items introduced on all models last year as standard equipment are nine additional items or improvements in equipment for occupant safety, which will be standard in 1968. The Cleaner Air System is also standard on all 1968 models.
