

A BOOT BUILT FOR BUSINESS.

The Falcon boot has a usable capacity of 452 litres. Plenty of space for an LPG tank and luggage besides. In the wagon there's a whopping 1466 litre luggage capacity. Both the sedan bootlid and the wagon's tailgate incorporate dual gas struts and open from bumper height to allow quicker and easier loading.

DEALING WITH POWER.

Providing the power is a new four litre 6 cylinder engine with multipoint electronic fuel injection. It's designed to produce 148kW of power at 4500 rpm and 348 Nm of torque at 3750 rpm. For optimum fuel efficiency, the engine is controlled by Ford's EEC4 Engine Management System and incorporates

Integrated Powertrain Control, in which a highly advanced microprocessor controls both engine and automatic transmission. Converting the engine to LPG operation is no problem.

MAKING CHANGES.

The standard transmission is a five speed manual but if you'd prefer, a four speed T-bar or four speed column shift automatic is available at extra cost. The automatic transmission, designed, developed and built here in Australia, features

Suspension and steering are two areas where this latest Falcon has significant upgrades. Both sedans and wagons are fitted with the advanced SLALS front suspension, with Watts Link rear suspension in sedans and Hotchkiss system in wagons.

All suspensions now feature revised spring rates, and nitrogencharged gas shock absorbers along with changes to upper and lower rear suspension bushes and mountings. All of which are designed to produce an improved ride whilst retaining precise and predictable handling characteristics. The power - assisted rack and pinion steering now features solid mountings for improved road 'feel' as well as a 'quicker' steering ratio of 18.5 to 1.

Also beneath the car is the sheer stopping power of power-assisted four wheel disc brakes.

LOOKING AHEAD.

Falcon's large glass areas and slim pillars make for excellent visibility, whilst tinting to side and rear windows and top of the windscreen cut down glare and heat.

And because security is an increasingly important issue, high security 'Tibbe' door, boot, tailgate and



ignition locks are fitted, with extra reinforcement for the ignition lock barrel.

NUDGE-NUDGE, BLINK-BLINK.

Body protection is provided by large wrap-around bumpers and body side protection mouldings.

Exterior mirrors can fold away to avoid accidental damage.

And large, bright stop lamps and indicators let other road users know of your intentions clearly.
